**GUIDELINES FOR ELEMENTARY & MIDDLE SCHOOL**

**Scientific Thought**

- Is the problem or question stated clearly?
- Does the hypothesis predict an answer to the question and explain why?
- Was the investigation repeated?
- Was the sample size sufficient for this project?
- Are conclusions or summary remarks justified by the data?
- States whether or not data supports hypothesis.
- Are conclusions drawn and stated?
- Does this project have application in the real world?
- Are the procedures & materials list clear and concise?

**Data**

- Does the data have a title?
- Is the data labeled correctly? (quantitative and qualitative graphed appropriately?)
- Data is displayed sequentially? (observational/pictures)
- Is there sufficient data presented? Variety (tables, graphs, charts)
- Was a logbook, notebook, laptop used to record data and observations?

## From the School Nurse

**Scoliosis Screening:** Attention parents of students in grades 5-9 who DO NOT have a current physical dated after Sept. 1, 2010 for their child: the school nurse will conduct a visual examination for scoliosis (curvature of the spine). The exam is done during gym class during the months of February and March.

**Flu Facts:** Flu is contagious 24 hours before symptoms occur to 24 hours after symptoms are gone - hence the need to be fever-free WITHOUT fever lowering medication, and symptom-free 24 hours before returning to school. Symptoms of the seasonal flu include fever greater than 100F, cough, sore throat, body aches, headaches, chills and fatigue. These symptoms can hit suddenly. The best prescriptions are: rest, fluids, along with pain and fever-

reducing medication. Parents with students that have asthma, diabetes, or other chronic diseases should consult their health care providers.

**Allergies:** Let your bus district know if your child has life-threatening allergies, and/or a chronic medical condition (i.e. asthma, diabetes, seizure disorder, bleeding disorder, etc.) and inform bus transportation if the student self-carries an inhaler, Epi-pen, glucagon, etc.

**Cold Weather:** Parents make sure your children are dressed appropriately for the weather. NYS law requires buses to be turned off after 5 min of idling due to emissions. That means the bus will be cold!
