An Honest Appraisal of the Emotional Life of Christ

If you are looking for a text that will challenge your thinking about the theology and psychology you will need to examine B.B. Warfield's The Person and the Work of Christ. Warfield was an outstanding theologian at Princeton University from 1887-1921. Warfield could systematically dissect the various key theological matters of Scripture in a thorough and honest fashion. In his chapter on *The Emotional Life of Our Lord*, Warfield investigated how Jesus clearly expressed compassion, anger, love, authentic and deep friendships with others. If you have ever wondered how Jesus really expressed his emotions, Warfield's work should be objectively considered as an indispensable read. After reading this text a number of years ago I was encouraged to walk away and say to myself, "I rejoice that Jesus was/is not a stoic."

Wow!!! Is the only word to describe the presentation on the Slavery History in America, featured by Teresa Wood from the History Houses. Many students knew about slavery or had some knowledge about slavery, the Civil War or what freedom meant, but the presentation made it real and easier to understand the problems that occurred in the 1700's. By incorporating the "American Doll" theme into the presentation brought everything to life and gave the sensation that you were back in the days of slavery. From the Kindergartners to the 5th Grade students, all were engrossed and fascinated. We would love to see the History Houses return to WCS.

From the School Nurse

Sports Physicals : Sports physicals are available for those individuals who can't schedule an appointment with their own healthcare provider. The district physician can't clear any sports/phys ed. restrictions or prescribe any medications. You must see your own healthcare provider for any clearance and medication orders. Sports physicals will be given on June 13th and June 14th from 5 pm - 6:45 pm at Shroeder High School's Gym - use back entrance.

Headaches, Stomach Aches, Sore Throats & Coughs are common at school. An MD's order for PRN pain medication and/or an antacid may be very helpful and enable your child to stay in school. An order from a healthcare provider, parent signature(gives permission), and the medication, must be provided by the parent. Feel free to send in your child with cough drops at any time. No MD order or parent permission needed for cough drops only!

RE: Injuries & Illnesses: Anytime your child sees a healthcare provider for any injury or illness that requires restrictions from gym class, sports and/or recess, please obtain an excuse that states the problem, activity restriction and next visit date. Continue to send in updates until the student is cleared by MD to resume all activities. Please give all information to nurse or main office. We will be sure that copies are provided for the Phys. Ed teacher and coaches.

Asthma: Students who may require an inhaler at school (even for a brief time) must have an MD's orders and parents written permission. This includes any student in K-12. Elementary level students rarely self-carry their inhalers.
